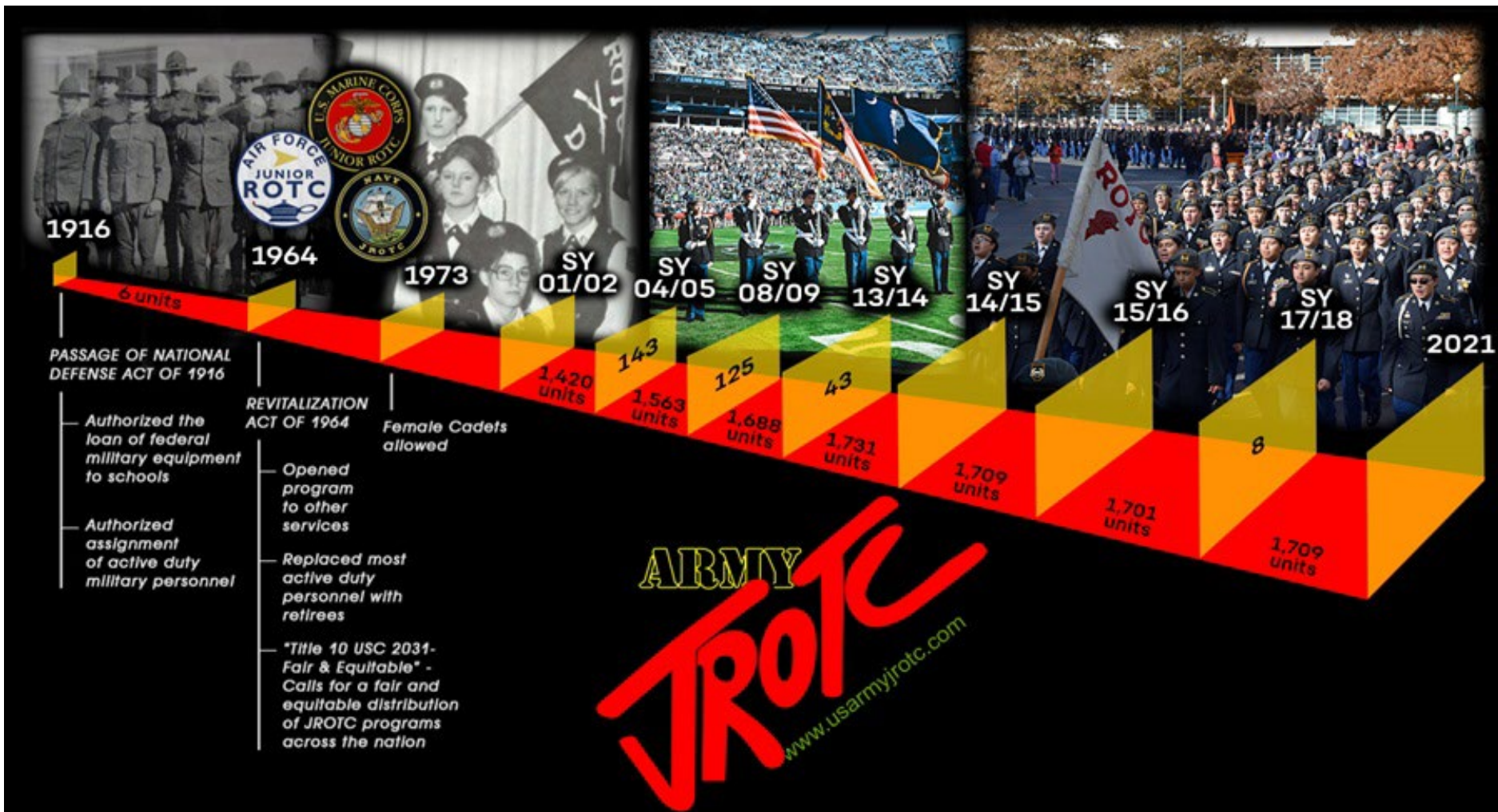

- ✓ Conversion made in record time because of the School District's Reputation

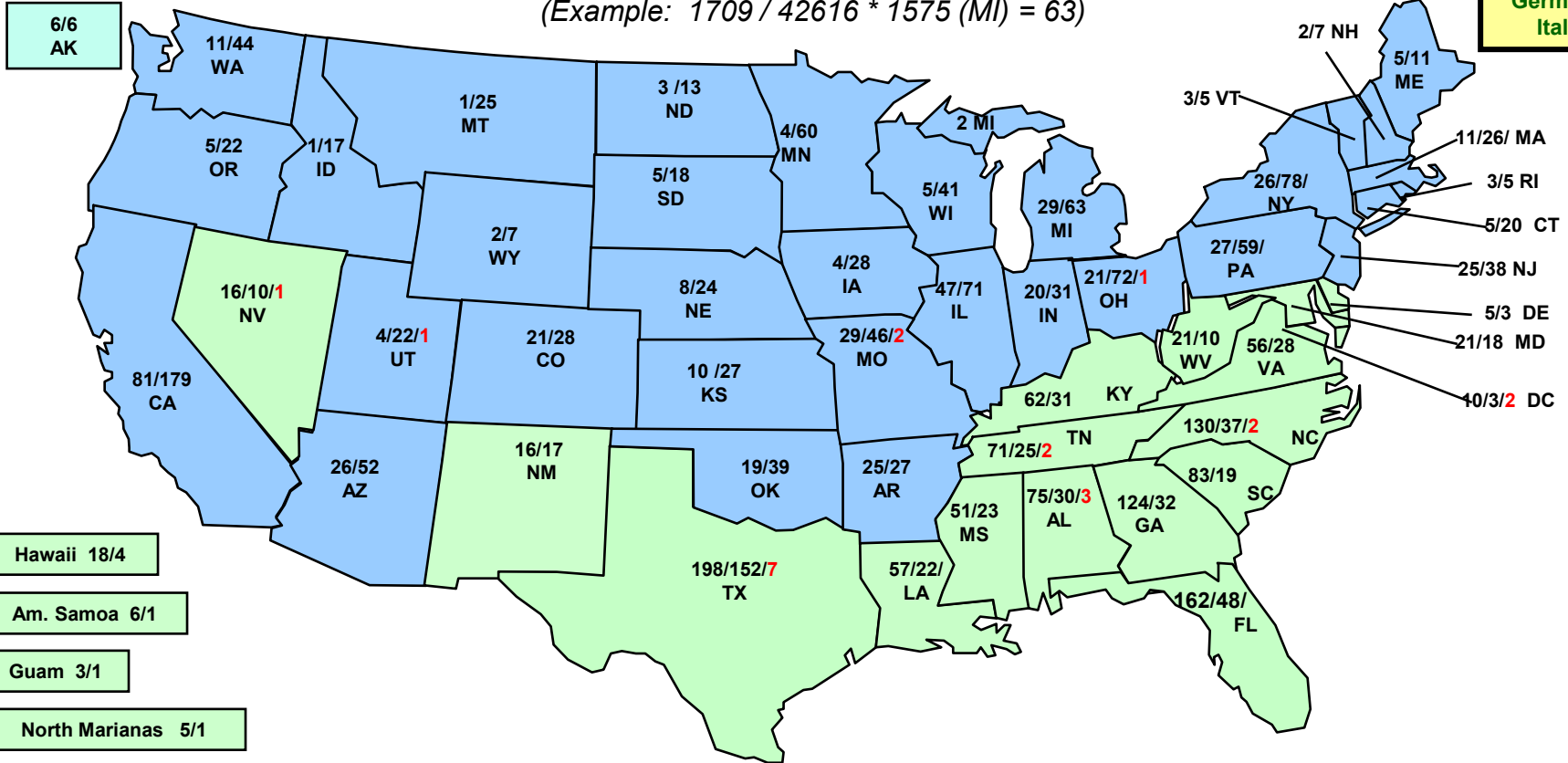


Snapshot of JROTC Nationwide

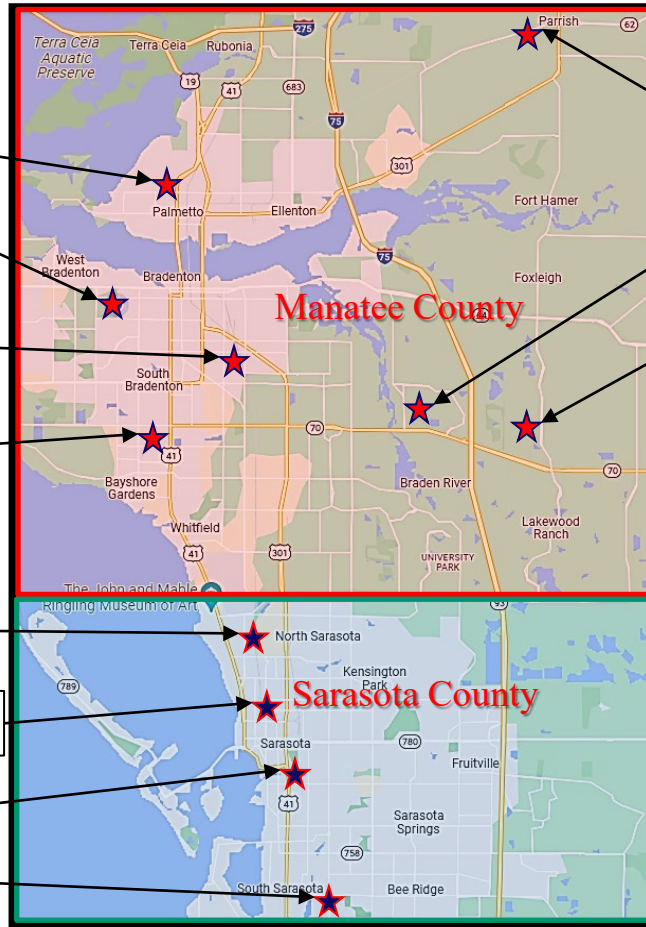

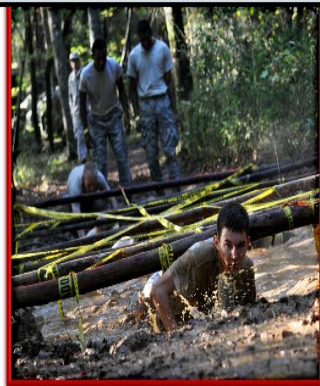


JROTC Leadership and Academic Bowl (JLAB)

Program for challenging Cadets to learn values of leadership, and citizenship, while preparing for higher education milestones (i.e. college entrance exams)

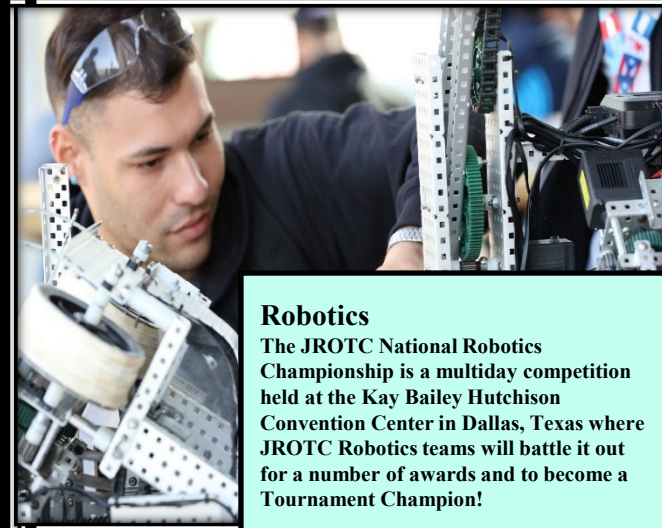
Raider Challenge

One-week college residential program of STEM labs; interaction with professors, graduate and undergraduate students



Robotics

The JROTC National Robotics Championship is a multiday competition held at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center in Dallas, Texas where JROTC Robotics teams will battle it out for a number of awards and to become a Tournament Champion!

Competitive marksmanship program to promote teamwork, self confidence, and esprit de corps

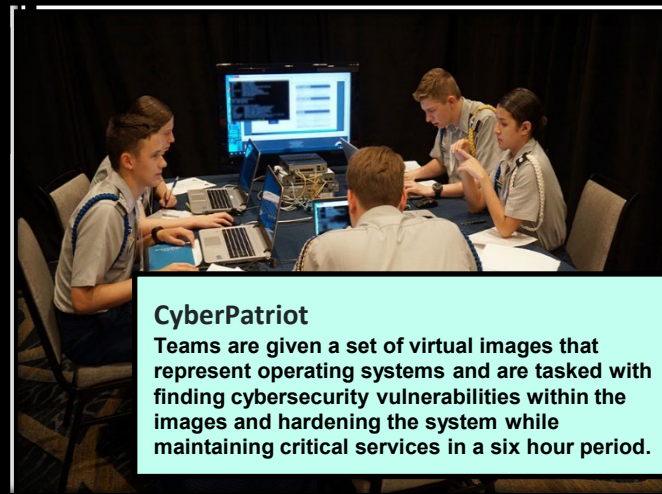


JROTC Cadet Leadership Challenge (JCLC)

Program opportunity for Cadets to practice leadership and teamwork skills in a hands-on leadership setting

Drill Competitions

Competitive drill program in both regulation and exhibition categories



CyberPatriot

Teams are given a set of virtual images that represent operating systems and are tasked with finding cybersecurity vulnerabilities within the images and hardening the system while maintaining critical services in a six hour period.



Manatee County Basic Facts



- Initial Programs started in SY 93/94
- Programs at county high schools (7 JROTC); 162 in Florida
- 18 Instructors (7 SAIs; 11 AIs)
- Honor Units with Distinction (7)
 - Cadet Knowledge/Appearance
 - Continuous Improvement Plan and Service Learning
 - Drill and Ceremony
 - Instructor Education and Professional Development
- Parrish Community HS converted from a National Defense Cadet Corps (funded totally by the District) to a JROTC program in one year!

JROTC Creed

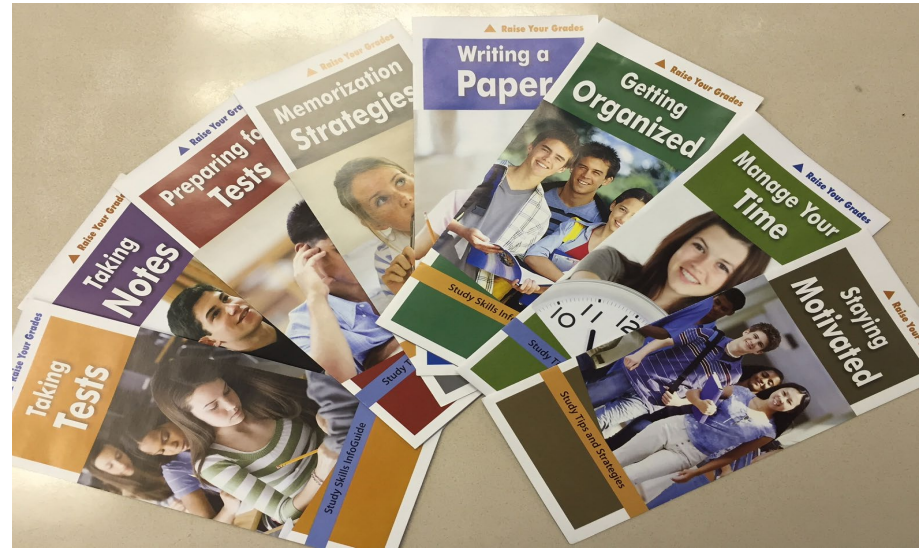
- I am an Army Junior ROTC Cadet.
